### **Kinston Enterprise Center on the Market**

The Downtown Kinston Revitalization non-profit has listed its 26,000sf office building. A small business incubator from 2003-2021, it served it purpose well for many small business start-ups and in facilitating downtown revitalization. The current Board of Directors and Executive Director feel it is time to relinquish the property, regroup, and refocus on next phase revitalization.

Listed by Jess Edwards of Kinston Realty Group, this property is move-in ready, has over 20 offices of varying sizes, a conference room, freight and passenger elevators, a loading dock, and many other amenities.

During the pandemic of 2020 and during 2021 existing tenants were allowed to go month-month with their leases in a effort to recover from their associated financial strains. This arrangement continues for them.

Current tenants have not been asked to vacate and are welcome to remain to meet with new owners at that time.

#### **MSD Stands for Municipal Service District**

With the MSD comes a property tax of \$0.27/\$100 assessed property value that amounts to \$58K and is designated as part of the budget to help support the downtown revitalization non-profit. The notion that a portion of one's revenues or that all of the property taxes in the MSD is awarded to Downtown Kinston Revitalization (DK) is incorrect. It is a small amount.

In 1984 DK joined the State and National Main Street Programs for historic commercial district revitalization. MSD arrangements are the norm with such programs. In the early years, programs were mostly stand-alone non-profits. The evolution now is to quasi-public-private relationships with the city whereby the Director is a City employee with revitalization experience to guide the non-profit that is governed by the Board of Directors; both working as a mutually supportive team.


